So as it turns out, the entire commission hinges on the center-point of making disciples. In a similar way, it's our hinge pin too. We could be doing a lot of really wonderful things in the world, but if we're not making disciples, we're failing.

- 6. CREATIVE, STRATEGIC PERSEVERANCE UNTIL THE RESULTS ARE ACHIEVED We will not quit; we will not falter. We will hope and believe and we will be victorious. We seek innovation, acknowledging in advance the possibility of failure.
- **7. GROWTH** We seek innovation, acknowledging in advance the possibility of failure.

This year our spiritual community has prayed for physical health, new jobs, broken relationships, and loneliness. We've helped a friend move to follow God's call, cleaned an apartment of someone who's sick, and kept in touch with people who are bogged down with busyness, travel, and isolation.

When Galatians 6:2 talks about carrying each other's burdens, it's talking about sin bearing the spiritual weight of others' mistakes and the brokenness of people as a whole.

There are times it feels like too much. It can be tempting to hold back and focus on my load and leave others to fend for themselves. But that neglects two important truths:

God is carrying our burdens with us, and He's designed communities to spread the load so that no one is crushed.

On our own and without God's help, life often is too much. But through getting to know God and being open with other people, the weight, while still heavy, is bearable. And it shows us strength and joy we didn't know we could have: in Christ, in our communities, and in ourselves.

CHANGED LIVES: Southeast Asia

We have a Team working in a Southeast Asian country, and in that part of the world government persecution of the Church is very common. In fact, one of our national leaders disappeared years ago, and we've never been able to discover where he is or if he's even alive. Recently a government official proclaimed that he would rid his province of all believers.

One of our workers, in another province maintains a strong witness for the Lord through a Christian company that has raised the standard of living for everyone involved. A village from that first province was suffering from attacks by an evil spirit. The village leader came to our workers' province and sought advice from the believers asking what they did about such problems. They reported that they had no such problems since they were followers of Jesus and He had power over all spirits.

The village leader returned to his village and told his fellow villagers, "We have two options, we can hire a more powerful Shaman and pay him to drive out the evil spirit, or we can become Christians." The entire village decided to become believers and they are being discipled! A government leader in that province said that Christianity was good for society, and asked the believers to please tell everyone about Jesus! We're praising God for this!
