

THE WORLD'S LARGEST UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS

Not that long ago, I found myself preparing for the 2013 North American Christian Convention. I knew that between four and five thousand people might end up attending. As I scanned through lists of Unreached People Groups (or UPGs - meaning the remaining tribes and ethnic groups in the world without adequate witness, as defined by global researchers), I began realizing how many groups still consisted of extremely large populations. I filtered the list for those with populations of 100,000 or more and was shocked to find that there were 1,587 of those UPGs. Those numbers astound me. Our team here quickly prepared a display with those 1,587 names listed on a large black wall, allowing would-be prayer advocates to sign up to pray for a specific group.

Since that day, hundreds of convention-goers and other volunteers have committed to praying for a particular group. And for that, we're extremely thankful. But today, I thought about those who were regular donors and pray-ers for Emerald Hills. Because Emerald Hills exists to reach all



those remaining groups, I realized that by embracing Emerald Hills, our partners were embracing unreached peoples. Emerald Hills exists because there is a mission that yet remains. And thank you to all our donors, friends, and prayer partners for making it possible!
